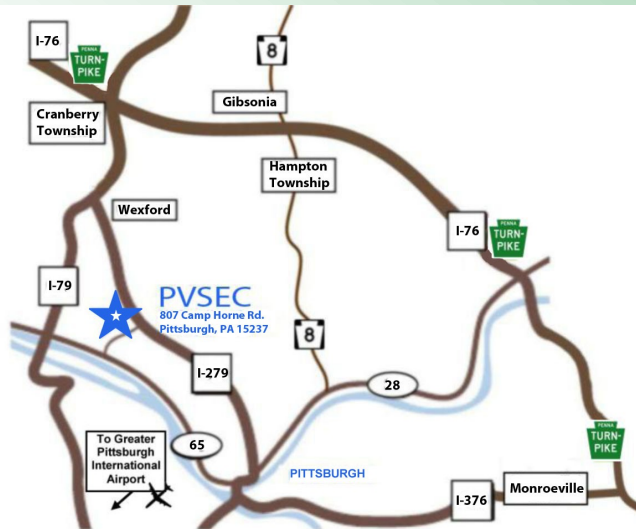

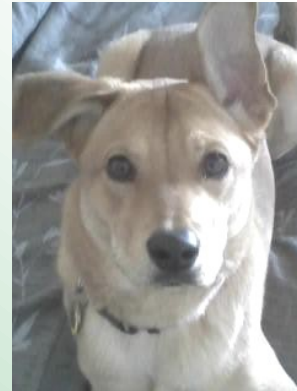

The PVSEC Cancer Center

combines all aspects of cancer treatment and diagnostics under one roof:

- **SURGERY** to diagnose and remove tumors.
- **ONCOLOGY** to treat residual or metastatic disease with chemotherapy, immunotherapy (such as the melanoma vaccine), or molecular therapy (such as Palladia).
- **RADIATION THERAPY** for tumors that cannot be completely removed due to location or extent, or that do not respond well to chemotherapy.
- **ADVANCED ON-SITE IMAGING** to obtain digital x-rays, ultrasound, CT and MRI for diagnosing, staging, and planning treatment.
